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Celtic Winters Slouchy Hat - Free One Skein Scarfie Crochet Pattern from Seven Days of Scarfie



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- One skein of [Lion Brand Scarfie](#) yarn ('Cream/Teal' pictured) or approx. 150 yards of a comparable Category 5 yarn for the adult sized hat
- J/6.0mm crochet hook - I love [Clover Amour](#) or [check out these adorable custom polymer clay hooks!](#)
- Scissors - I always keep these [travel scissors](#) in my [hook case](#)
- Yarn needle
- Optional pom pom maker

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Abbreviations (written in U.S. terms):

- ch: chain
- sl st: slip stitch
- BLO: back loop only
- SC: single crochet

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- HDC: half double crochet
- FPTr: Front post treble crochet

This left handed tutorial will show how to ...



Gauge

9 sts x 9 rows = 2" square using SC

Finished Size:

- Adult width = 9"
- Adult length = 10.5"
- Child width = 8.5"
- Child length = 9.5"
- Toddler width = 8"
- Toddler length = 8.5"

Pattern Notes

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do not count as a stitch.

- The last stitch of each round is attached to the first stitch of the round with a slip stitch.
- This pattern can be adjusted in multiples of fours.

Toddler Sized

Bottom Ribbing - Working in Rows

ch 9

Row 1: SC in the second ch from the hook and SC across (8). Turn

Row 2-44: ch 1, working in BLO, SC across (8). Turn.

When you finish the ribbed band, fold it so that Row 1 and 44 are on top of one another. Working through the back loop of Row 44 and the front loop of Row 1, seam the two rows together by slip stitching across. Do not cut your yarn. Continue on to work in rounds along the “raw” edge of ribbed band.

(remember the last stitch of each round is attached to the first stitch of the round with a slip stitch)

Round 1: ch 1, SC around the top of the band working one stitch per row (44). Attach to first SC of the round with a sl st

Round 2 (first round of celtic weave stitch): Ch 3, *skip 2 sts, FPTr in next 2, working OVER your previous two stitches- FPTr in the two skipped stitches. Repeat from * around. This will create a round of crossed stitches (11 sets total, 44 sts)

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working BEHIND the posts of your previous two stitches- FPTr in the 3rd and 4th stitch you skipped at the beginning of the round, *skip 2, FPTr in next 2 sts, then working BEHIND the posts of your previous two stitches FPTr in the two skipped stitches. Repeat from * around. (44)

Round 4: Ch 3, skip 4 stitches, FPTr in next 2 sts, then working OVER the posts of your previous two stitches- FPTr in the 3rd and 4th stitch you skipped at the beginning of the round, *skip 2, FPTr in next 2 sts, then working OVER the posts of your previous two stitches FPTr in the two skipped stitches. Repeat from * around. (44)

Round 5-10: Repeat Rounds 3 (on odd rounds) and 4 (on even rounds).

Round 11: ch 1, SC2Tog around (23). Tie off yarn leaving a long (12"+) tail.

Using a yarn needle, weave the yarn back and forth through the stitches of Round 11. Pull tight to cinch the top of the hat closed. Make and attach a pom pom if desired. Weave in all ends.

Child Sized

Bottom Ribbing - Working in Rows

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ch 10

Row 1: SC in the second ch from the hook and SC across (9). Turn

Row 2-48: ch 1, working in BLO, SC across (9). Turn.

When you finish the ribbed band, fold it so that Row 1 and 48 are on top of one another. Working through the back loop of Row 48 and the front loop of Row 1, seam the two rows together by slip stitching across. Do not cut your yarn. Continue on to work in rounds along the “raw” edge of ribbed band.

(remember the last stitch of each round is attached to the first stitch of the round with a slip stitch)

Round 1: ch 1, SC around the top of the band working one stitch per row (48). Attach to first SC of the round with a sl st.

Round 2 (first round of celtic weave stitch): Ch 3, *skip 2 sts, FPTr in next 2, working OVER your previous two stitches- FPTr in the two skipped stitches. Repeat from * around. This will create a round of crossed stitches (12 sets total, 48 sts).

Round 3: Ch 3, skip 4 stitches, FPTr in next 2 sts, then working BEHIND the posts of your previous two stitches- FPTr in the 3rd and 4th stitch you skipped at

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two stitches FPTr in the two skipped stitches. Repeat from * around. (48)

Round 4: Ch 3, skip 4 stitches, FPTr in next 2 sts, then working OVER the posts of your previous two stitches- FPTr in the 3rd and 4th stitch you skipped at the beginning of the round, *skip 2, FPTr in next 2 sts, then working OVER the posts of your previous two stitches FPTr in the two skipped stitches. Repeat from * around. (48)

Round 5-11: Repeat Rounds 3 (on odd rounds) and 4 (on even rounds).

Round 12: ch 1, SC2Tog around (24). Tie off yarn leaving a long (12"+) tail.

Using a yarn needle, weave the yarn back and forth through the stitches of Round 12. Pull tight to cinch the top of the hat closed. Make and attach a pom pom if desired. Weave in all ends.

Adult Sized

Bottom Ribbing - Working in Rows

ch 10

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across (9). Turn

Row 2-52: ch 1, working in BLO, SC across (9). Turn.

When you finish the ribbed band, fold it so that Row 1 and 52 are on top of one another. Working through the back loop of Row 52 and the front loop of Row 1, seam the two rows together by slip stitching across. Do not cut your yarn. Continue on to work in rounds along the “raw” edge of ribbed band.

(remember the last stitch of each round is attached to the first stitch of the round with a slip stitch)

Round 1: ch 1, SC around the top of the band working one stitch per row (52). Attach to first SC of the round with a sl st.

Round 2 (first round of celtic weave stitch): Ch 3, *skip 2 sts, FPTr in next 2, working OVER your previous two stitches- FPTr in the two skipped stitches. Repeat from * around. This will create a round of crossed stitches (13 sets total, 52 sts).

Round 3: Ch 3, skip 4 stitches, FPTr in next 2 sts, then working BEHIND the posts of your previous two stitches- FPTr in the 3rd and 4th stitch you skipped at



two stitches FPTr in the two skipped stitches. Repeat from * around. (52)

Round 4: Ch 3, skip 4 stitches, FPTr in next 2 sts, then working OVER the posts of your previous two stitches- FPTr in the 3rd and 4th stitch you skipped at the beginning of the round, *skip 2, FPTr in next 2 sts, then working OVER the posts of your previous two stitches FPTr in the two skipped stitches. Repeat from * around. (52)

Round 5-12: Repeat Rounds 3 (on odd rounds) and 4 (on even rounds).

Round 13: ch 1, SC2Tog around (26). Tie off yarn leaving a long (12"+) tail.

Using a yarn needle, weave the yarn back and forth through the stitches of Round 12. Pull tight to cinch the top of the hat closed. Make and attach a pom pom if desired. Weave in all ends.
